- The freedom of the press is fundamental. Newspaper may make fair comments on matters of public interest, but such comments should not prejudice a fair trial. The Sunday Times wrote an article on the plight of the Thalidomide case and in 1972, the A. G. Sought to restrain them from publishing their article. It is reported in the Court of Appeal in AGV Times Newspapers Ltd [1973] and in the House of Lords in 1974. Mothers when pregnant had taken the drug thalidomide. Their children were born with deformities in 1962. Except five, all parents agreed to a settlement. The editor of Sunday Times launched a campaign against the distillers who gave the drugs. Ten years had passed and the children got no compensation from the distillers.
